Colonized with Schwabs from all over Banat mainly after 1830

At the beginning of the XX Century, the inhabitants from the Vest part of Voiteg were called *Vârcegani* after the vanished village Vârceg. The inhabitants from the East part were known as *Bolianți* after a vanished village named Bolia.

Today's Location: in Timiș County, România, at 32 km South of Timișoara City.

Railroad station: Voiteni

RC Church: the first RC Oratorium [i.e. place for pray] was build and blessed in 1872 in honor of Saint Alexandrum Eppumm Martyr. Today's RC Church was raised in 1902.

RC Parish: up to 1919 filial parish of Ciacova; after 1919 had his own parish; today, filial parish of Deta.

Miscellaneous:

The village was founded before 1322.

In the XVII Century it was inhabited mainly by Romanians; in 1717 the village had 28 houses [paying taxes?].

Under Banat's governor Joseph BRIGIDO -i.e. 1774-'77- the village was re-build.

The Schwabs came mainly after 1830; in 1841 here lived already 200 Schwabs.

At the end of the XIX century in the village existed already: railroad station, post office, telegraphic office, etc.

The Orthodox Church was raised in 1907.

The earthquake from 1991 destroyed / damaged more then 500 buildings in the village.
